#### SCREENING OF ERIN SHIRREFF'S "SON" Tuesday, November 16, 10 am–6 pm Auditorium

A free screening of artist Erin Shirreff's video *Son* (2018; 45 minutes, looped, silent) will be presented throughout the day. This large-scale projection, based on a solar eclipse, combines appropriated images with ones made by the artist into a seamless, meditative work. Visitors can come or go at any time during this looped, non-narrative video. This program is in conjunction with Erin Shirreff's current exhibition, *Remainders*, on view in public spaces at the Clark, and is accompanied by live conversation with the artist at 6 pm in the Clark's auditorium.

#### CONVERSATION WITH ARTIST ERIN SHIRREFF Tuesday, November 16, 6–7:30 pm Auditorium

Join Montreal-based artist Erin Shirreff for a conversation about her latest body of work, now on view in a solo-show in New York, as well as her current exhibition at the Clark, *Remainders*. Shirreff will be in conversation with associate curator of contemporary projects, Robert Wiesenberger, as they explore the many connections between her photography, video, and sculpture. This program is in conjunction with a free screening of Shirreff's video *Son* (2018), which will be screened in the auditorium throughout the day.

#### OPENING LECTURE FOR *COMPETING CURRENTS: 20TH-CENTURY JAPANESE PRINTS* Saturday, November 6, 2 pm EST On Zoom

Exhibition curator Oliver Ruhl looks at two distinct but intertwining currents in 20th-century Japanese printmaking, *shin-hanga* and *sōsaku-hanga*, and details how artists from this period engaged with a shifting modernity.
